The Portland Water District (PWD) is an independent, quasi-municipal organization chartered in 1908 and is governed by a publicly elected Board of Trustees. PWD's mission is to protect public health and the environment by providing highquality water services.


DRINKING WATER

Sebago Lake serves as the primary water source for nearly all PWD customers, except a small portion served by wells in Steep Falls. We take great pride in serving water sourced from Sebago Lake, Maine's secondlargest and deepest lake. Surrounded by forests, the lake is exceptionally pure and of such high quality that it is exempt from the filtration requirements set by the Safe Drinking Water Act. Only about 50 out of 13,000 surface water supplies across the country are able to serve unfiltered water. Lake

Protecting the source is the first step to ensure high-quality drinking water. PWD actively engages in numerous environmental protection efforts to preserve the quality of Sebago Lake and its watershed.

Effective water treatment, extensive laboratory monitoring and sampling, and a proactive approach to maintaining the water distribution system further ensure dependable service and fresh, clean, safe water.
